The AS Level / A Level Psychology is a Full-time Further Education course in the Sixth Form Academy (SFA), designed for students who are interested in the field of psychology and becoming a psychologist.

If you have ever wondered ‘Why do we forget?’ or ‘Why are some people more likely to commit crime more than others?’ or ‘How does our brain work?’ then you have asked some of the questions that psychologists ask.

Psychology is the scientific study of the mind and behaviour. Psychologists attempt to describe how people behave and explain why. To do this course, you need to enjoy reading and critical thinking. Studying this subject enables you to think about the explanations that psychologists have put forward to explain certain behaviours. You will consider the criticisms of this research and how thinking has changed over time.

Some of the topics covered in this course may raise issues that could become personally distressing to some individuals, e.g. explanations of phobia; treatment of mental disorders; and the use of animals in experiments. If you think you will be affected, we advise you to consider this before choosing to study this course.
