

Wellbeing and Health in the Community Diploma in Higher Education (Full-Time)

Those that choose to work within the diverse field of Community Health and Wellbeing must be able to meet the person-centred, holistic care needs of the people they encounter in their practice. Individuals accessing services may be at any stage of life and may have a range of mental, physical, cognitive or behavioural health challenges.

This course is designed to equip you with the values, knowledge and skills that can be utilised and are specifically relevant to employment in Wellbeing and Social Care within the community. The programme reflects contemporary issues, changing trends and challenges within the sector and has an emphasis on improving the quality of service within this emerging field of practice. You will study a range of topics including psychological and social aspects of health and illness, debates and dilemmas in health and social care and mental health and wellbeing.

Entry Requirements

This course is suitable for anyone interested in pursuing a career within the diverse field of Community Health and Wellbeing, and also welcomes mature learners with or without experience of working within the field of Health & Social Care. We aim to reflect the multidisciplinary approach required in this sector and actively seek prospective students from varied employment/academic backgrounds.

To be eligible for entry onto this course, students must have achieved 120 Credits at Level 4.

Career Prospects

Progression can be to professional degree pathways such as Mental Health Nursing, Social work, Occupational Therapy and the top up BSc Health and Wellbeing degree or to transfer directly into a broad range of employment opportunities in fields such as Counselling, Alternative therapeutic practices, Voluntary sector project management, Domiciliary care, Residential Care, Assisted Independent Living, Probationary work, Police force, Youth work.
