



Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are so pleased to see more of our students, across all curriculum areas, return to the classroom after the Easter break.

- **April 12**, for Neath College; Afan College; Llandarcy Academy of Sport; Pontardawe College; Maesteg and Swansea Construction Centre.
- **April 13**, for Brecon Beacons College and Newtown College.

Students should have received notification of which groups they are in and the days they are attending.

It has been a strange time for us all and as we start returning to NPTC Group of Colleges, we are asking all staff and students to follow the health and safety guidelines and stay safe. Returning is going to be busy as students and staff catch up on outstanding work and prepare for year-end assessments, so we want to make you aware of the safety guidance:

Induction: On return, students will have an induction, so they know what needs to be done to stay safe. We will revert to the arrangements that we had in place during the Autumn term. This means that students will be placed into contact groups for classroom teaching and required to follow the social distancing arrangements that have been put in place, which will depend on the type of study programme they are following. These arrangements will be explained fully by the teaching staff during the induction programme.

We will continue to follow the advice and guidance produced by Welsh Government and Public Health Wales.

Safety and Face Coverings: It is important at this time that we all think about others. The College will ask each student to complete their own daily health check. It asks that if they or any member of your household becomes unwell with a high temperature, persistent cough or any other COVID-19 related symptoms they should **NOT** attend the college and must inform their teaching staff immediately by email.

When in College students will be asked to:

- wear a suitable face covering (3-layer) in all College communal areas and may be required to wear a face covering in class or an exam room – this is under review.
- adhere to all social distanced guidelines, in all areas of the College including classrooms and workshops – in College that is 2 metres.
- follow the tutors' instructions regarding cleaning and preparing any equipment they may be using.
- follow and understand the induction guidance their tutor will give in respect of safe working practices in study areas.

If travelling to College on a college bus or public transport, then they will be refused entry to the bus unless they are wearing a face covering. Please ensure they have a face covering before leaving home.

Ventilation: Plenty of fresh air is encouraged to circulate in classrooms. Doors and windows will be open where possible, so ensure clothing is appropriate in case of cold weather.

Lateral Flow Testing: All students have been offered Lateral Flow Tests to use at home. You should have received all the information but for further guidance, please see links below:

Free College Meals will continue until the end of May.
